Taylor and Walker attorneys win summary judgment for civil engineering firm which designed large residential subdivision.

Hampton, VA - Sledd & Associates, a civil engineering firm which designed a three hundred plus lot subdivision on 140 acres of land was sued by the developer who claimed that it incurred substantial additional costs in building the subdivision due to soil conditions encountered during construction. The developer claimed that the engineer should have designed the subdivision differently to minimize the cost of excavating and hauling of unsuitable soil material from the construction site. Taylor and Walker attorneys John Franklin, III, and Brian N. Casey successfully argued that the developer sustained no damages caused by the subdivision design and obtained summary judgment for the engineer in the Hampton Circuit Court.
